

CLUB ICE GUIDELINES

Greenville Figure Skating Club purchases ice time from Greenville County Recreation Department (GCRD) for two main purposes: (i) to hold Test sessions, with USFSA-certified judges, in order to give qualified skaters the opportunity to test through the various levels and disciplines that the USFSA has established; and (ii) to provide ice time exclusively for Greenville FSC skaters between 30 and 35 times a year. These Club Ice sessions have traditionally taken place on designated Tuesday evenings from 6:00 p. m. to 7:30 p.m. The following principles govern the use of Club Ice:

(a) Club Ice is for the benefit of all qualified Greenville FSC skaters, but on special occasions and following a decision by the Board, the Secretary of Greenville FSC shall formally invite particular skaters in writing to perform programs during Club Ice time and guarantee them clear ice to do so

(b) No arrangements may be made on behalf of particular skaters without the prior approval of the Greenville FSC Board. Such arrangements might include, but are not limited to, solo performances by skaters for members of the media or for invited judges or other interested parties. Prior approval should be sought in writing by the coaches of the skaters in question

(c) Any approval for special arrangements granted by the Board shall be conditional on the Board's judgment of the benefit of such arrangements to the Club as a whole and shall be subject to review and approval by GCRD through the Skating Director. As a general rule, the use of club ice by Greenville FSC shall be managed in a way that conforms to the general regulations for use of the Pavilion laid down by GCRD.

(d) Prospective members of Greenville FSC may skate on any or all Club Ice sessions between the time of Greenville FSC's receiving their applications and checks for a skating membership and the time of the Board's meeting to approve or deny their memberships. If their memberships are approved, they may continue to skate as regular members. If they are denied membership, they may not skate subsequently on Club Ice.

(e) Club members may sponsor two guests each year. A skater may be a guest no more than twice a year. Guests will be charged \$5.00 per skate.

(f) To skate on Club Ice, skaters must skate regularly and be skilful enough not to pose a danger to themselves or to others. For beginning skaters, the minimal level of skill shall correspond to at least one of the following: ISI Freestyle 1; working towards Pre-preliminary MIF; working towards Preliminary Dance; or taking private lessons.

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
